Michael graduated from the University of Oxford with an MSc degree in Global Health Science. Prior to Oxford, he attended St. Paul's College in Hong Kong, and then entered the University of Southern California (USC) where he obtained two BA degrees in Comparative Literature and in History.

Michael began his career in the education sector, first as an intern at the USC Shoah Foundation Institute for Visual History and Education - a non-profit organisation in Los Angeles founded by the film director, Steven Spielberg. He later joined the Department of Educational Studies at Hong Kong Baptist University (HKBU), where he conducted academic research into World War II, before joining the Oxford University Press (China) in later years to focus on publishing and early childhood education. Michael also possesses extensive knowledge of e-learning through his previous appointment at NetDragon - a leading global firm that develops educational technologies. Currently, he is also the President of The Oxford and Cambridge Society of Hong Kong - the association that represents both Oxford and Cambridge alumni. In this role, Michael is involved in organising many academic and charitable events.

Before joining Brakeley Asia in 2016 as a consultant, Michael has been involved in fundraising since 2009 when he helped organise a series of events for the benefit of the Yan Chai Hospital Emergency Assistance Relief Fund, which aims at providing financial aid for unfortunate persons in Hong Kong to cover medical and living expenses. Over the years, he has led other fundraising drives through The Oxford and Cambridge Society of Hong Kong and his Rotary Club, in support of student projects and learning experiences both locally and abroad.
